In 2018, the Qld Labor Government legalised abortion up to birth

As a result of this new law, of which the Premier is so proud, mid to late-term abortion in Queensland has more than doubled to a total of 1,137 in the four years from 2019 to 2022, with 179 of these babies being born alive and left to die.*

During the recent State Parliament inquiry into Robbie Katter's Termination of Pregnancy (Live Births) Amendment Bill 2024, a clinical midwife who works at a public hospital south of Brisbane testified that babies are born alive in Queensland hospitals due to late-term abortion.

She stated that some midwives were distressed because they were “unable to provide care for the baby... but were limited to provide comfort care only”. She said that one “baby boy fought for his life for five hours before taking his final breath. This is not an uncommon occurrence” (*The Australian*, 20/8/24).
